# **Associate Nursing Degree (ADN)**

Fall 2019 Admission Policy

#### **ASSOCIATE DEGREE NURSING (ADN) Fall 2019 Admissions Policy:**

Students are admitted to Wilson Community College in accordance with policies approved by the administration. Admission is not guaranteed to all applicants who apply to the Associate Degree Nursing program. Completion of the nursing curriculum does not guarantee success in passing the licensure exam. A nursing student must be admitted/readmitted to the Associate Degree Nursing program in order to take nursing (NUR) courses for credit, with the exception of repeating NUR117.

#### STEP I Application Process: Deadline: March 15

- A. Applicants must submit an admissions application to Wilson Community College with an official high school transcript or equivalency and all post-secondary coursework. Currently enrolled high school students are to submit a partial transcript at the time of application. A final transcript must be submitted at the time of high school graduation.
- B. Applicants must be eligible for admission to the college.
- C. Applicants must complete an Allied Health Intent Form available under Allied Health at www.wilsoncc.edu.

#### STEP II Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS): Deadline: March 15

Applicants who have completed Step I will schedule an appointment to take the TEAS by contacting Student Development at 252-246-1281 or 252-246-1276. Applicants are allowed to take the TEAS twice in a 12 month period at least 30 days apart. The highest TEAS score taken within the last two years will be used for ranking.

- A. Applicants will be required to pay a \$55.00 testing fee to the Business Office (F-101)
- B. Picture ID and payment receipt must be presented at the time of testing.
- C. Applicants who opt to take the TEAS at another institution must submit final TEAS scores by the March 15 deadline in order for them to be considered.
- D. Associate Degree Nursing applicants <u>must achieve a 63.3%</u> on the overall adjusted score.

#### **STEP III Program-Specific Requirements:**

Applicants must be actively listed on the North Carolina Nurse Aide I (NA I) registry no later than March 15. Students must remain active on the NA I registry while enrolled in the ADN program. Applicants must have a grade point average of 2.0 or higher on all general education (non-NUR prefix) courses that are required for the ADN program.

#### **STEP IV Conditional Acceptance and Ranking:**

- A. Should there be more qualified applicants than space available, a point system will be used to rank applicants and determine selection for admission to the Associate Degree Nursing program. The following items will be used in consideration for ranking:
  - TEAS Adjusted Individual Score.
  - Non-nursing (NUR) courses. If applicant has taken courses more than once, the highest grade will be used to award points.
  - Diplomas (5 points), Associate Degrees (10 points), and Bachelor's Degree or higher (15 points). All documentation for ranking is due by March 15. Documentation received after this date will not be considered.
- B. Qualified applicants will receive a letter of conditional acceptance by April 15. Enclosed with this letter will be a Certificate of Acceptance (COA), a physical form, and information to complete your criminal background check and drug screen with immunizations and how to upload it to Immunitrax.
- C. COAs are due to Student Development (F-100) by May 1.
- D. Physical forms are to be submitted to Immunitrax by May 15. Physical exams must be completed by a physician, nurse practitioner, or physician's assistant within 12 months prior to the first day of class.
  - 1. Immunizations required:
    - a. CPR Tetanus Tdap within the last 10 years,
    - b. Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR) 2 shots or a positive titer with results and date,
    - c. Hepatitis B (Hep B) 3 shots or a positive titer with results and date,
    - d. Varicella times two or a positive titer,
    - e. Annual flu vaccine by October 31st; and
    - f. 2 Step TB Skin test documentation with proof of annual test if more than a year old.

Immunizations may not be declined except by a written statement from the applicant's health care provider for acceptable exemptions.

2. Applicants must submit evidence of current American Heart Association (AHA) CPR certification for adult, infant and child with choking maneuver, and AED.

#### **STEP V Final Acceptance Requirements:**

Students must complete the following requirements before acceptance to the program is final.

- A. Student must order and complete the Criminal Background Check, Urine Drug Screen and immunization tracking as required by all clinical agencies by May 15 for final admission.
- B. Applicants must be in good academic standing (not on academic warning or probation) for consideration for final admission.
- C. Malpractice insurance is required to be paid each fall, after the first day of class but before the first day of clinical see <u>Fees and Expenses</u>.
- D. Students will have orientation during the summer before starting the program in the fall and uniforms will be ordered at this time.
- E. Each semester students are required to pay an ATI testing fee in addition to their tuition. This fee must be paid in order to register, graduate or attend pinning ceremony see <u>Fees and Expenses</u>.
- F. Clinical, in this program, begins at 6:30 a.m. two days a week and is subject to change based on hospital scheduling and faculty availability. In order to provide adequate training for the number of students, travel to surrounding counties may be expected.
- G. Students must earn a "C" in all NUR and BIO courses.
- H. Students in the ADN evening option have class 2 nights a week on Tuesday and Thursday and every other Saturday and Sunday is clinical. This admission is every other year on the odd year. In second semester, the evening option student must come on Wednesday evening for pharmacology.

# WILSON COMMUNITY C O L L E G E

Admission into the <u>Nurse Aide Level I</u> program is by application, and only <u>completed</u> applications will be accepted. Available classes for the <u>SUMMER 2018</u> semester are listed on the reverse side. <u>Registration fee is \$224</u> which includes: \$180 registration, \$5 technology, \$15 security, \$2 accident insurance, \$16 malpractice insurance, and \$6 CPR eCard.

Students must be at least 18 years of age. This course prepares students to perform basic nursing skills for patients/residents, regardless of setting. Training includes class, laboratory, clinical experience and CPR training. The CPR book is \$20. Students must attend 90% of all class sessions; maintain an 80% average on all tests; and the final exam score must be 80% or better. Upon successful completion, students will be eligible to take the State's certification exam. Cost of certification exam is \$101 – Students pay by credit or debit card (Discover cards are not accepted).

The Division of Continuing Education of Wilson Community College recognizes and is fully supportive of clinical agencies that require a drug screen, background check, or fingerprinting on students. Costs of these tests are the responsibility of the student. The College has partnered with castlebranch.com for these tests. No other provider will be accepted. Students have ten (10) days after class begins to complete this task and sign up with castlebranch.com. Failure to do so will result in student not being able to continue in the Nurse Aide I program. The cost is \$35. Students are required to sign up with Castle Branch at the following web address: http://portal.castlebranch.com/WD68. The package link to sign up for Nurse Aide I: WK69im: Medical Document Manager.

# **APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS**

Completed and signed application with each of the following required <u>copies</u> attached. It is the student's responsibility to obtain these copies. Wilson Community College will not make copies of required paperwork. **Keep the original records and BRING COPIES ONLY.** 

- ➤ High School Diploma, High School Equivalency, <u>or</u> Transcript
- ➤ Valid picture ID (example: unexpired driver's license) required per NCNA Registry
- Social Security Card
- **Proof of following immunizations:**
- Two TB skin tests within nine (9) months of class start date
- Two MMR (Mumps, Measles, Rubella)
- Three Hepatitis B (at least the first shot prior to the start date is required)
- Varicella injection *or* Titer (blood test to prove immunity to chicken pox)
- Tdap (within the past 10 years)

#### **REQUIRED** prior to clinical rotations:

<u>UNIFORMS</u>: Navy blue scrub-type top; white pants and white, closed-toe shoes. Skirts and/or dresses must be approved by the Instructor prior to clinical rotation. Uniforms are available at Wilson Community College's Bookstore. Name tags are available in building "F" prior to clinical rotation. Name tags are required for Clinical.
