

College Transfer Pathway: Associate Degree Nursing (P1032c)

Career & College Promise (CCP)

CCP provides opportunities for eligible NC high school students to take tuition-free, college courses for dual credit (some students may have to pay for textbooks and materials). Taking CCP courses accelerates completion of college certificates, diplomas, applied associate degrees that provide entry-level job skills, and associate degrees that lead to transfer within the UNC System of 4-year colleges and universities and many private institutions.

Associate Degree Nursing Pathway

Eligibility Requirements

- High School Junior or Senior (sophomores may be eligible with different criteria)
- Unweighted GPA of 2.8 or higher; OR, Demonstrate college readiness in English, reading, and math on an approved assessment

General CCP Admission Requirements

- College CCP Application
- High School Transcript
- Verification Form

****SPECIAL NOTE: Admission to ADN Programs are not guaranteed and require advanced planning, a separate application, additional testing, pre-requisites, active listing on Nurse Aide Registry, etc.**

About the ADN Pathway

The Career and College Promise (CCP) ADN Pathway is designed for high school juniors and seniors who wish to begin their educational studies toward the Associate in Nursing degree (2-y) and a Baccalaureate degree in Nursing (4-y).

The Pathway is based on Block 1 of the Uniform Articulation Agreement between the University of North Carolina's Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs and the North Carolina Community College Associate Degree Nursing Programs.

A student who completes an Associate in Applied Science (AAS) in Nursing, which includes the courses listed below,

with a GPA of at least 2.0 and a grade of C or better and completes the courses in Blocks 2-3 of the Uniform Articulation Agreement between the University of North Carolina's Registered Nurse to Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs and the North Carolina Community College Associate Degree Nursing Programs with a GPA of at least 2.0 and a grade of C or better, and who holds a current unrestricted license as a Registered Nurse in North Carolina, will have fulfilled the UNC institutions lower-division general education requirements as well as nursing program entry requirements. **However, because nursing program admissions are competitive, no student is guaranteed admission to the program of his or her choice.**

Associate Degree Nursing Pathway (Gen Ed -23 SHC)

These courses are part of **BLOCK 1** of the Five Block Degree Plan located within the RN to BSN Articulation Agreement.
